Our meeting location for CNYPCUG




Directions to the library:

The Deals Guy

I was reading the Orange County IBM PC Users Group newsletter (nibbles & bits) and noticed an interesting article. Linda Gonse does a great job of editing this great newsletter and those of you who don't get to read it are missing a real treat. I don't own an iPhone, but many of my readers do. Lorene Romero, North Coast Macintosh Users Group President (in Santa Rosa, CA), wrote the article about some unique items available for iPhones. Three that I found interesting are quoted below with Lorene's permission:

“Coffee Break: \$1.99 (****): Great app for those who love coffee! It has a very ‘fun’ interface with appropriate company cups. It has the usual suspects (Starbucks, Pete's and Seattle's Best), but it also has a category for ‘Other Coffee Places.’ It is a great app if you are a coffee hound, like I am. The seller is Marco Pifferi”

“AroundMe: Free (****): Cool little app that lets you find banks, coffee places, gas stations, supermarkets, and even an Apple store, located near you. First it finds your location and then accesses a database filled with local shops. I used it in Seaside, OR and found a wonderful coffee shop right down the street.”

“Say Who Free (****): Finally an app that brings back voice activation to the iPhone! Say any name (Jon Jones Mobile) and it will dial it every time for me.”

*Why Not Scrap The Crap?

One of the Vendors at the FACUG/APCUG Florida spring conference was Sunbelt Software. They offer Vipre Enterprise. They call the product a non-bloated antivirus, antispyware, and antirootkit software that includes other technologies to make it an all-in-one protection. They say it offers Real-Time Monitoring with Active Protection. Removing rootkits is supplemented by VIPRE's FirstScan™, which runs at the system's boot time. FirstScan bypasses the Windows operating system to directly scan certain locations of the hard drive for

malware, removing infections where found. They say Vipre's Active Protection delivers real time monitoring and protection against known and unknown malware threats. Active Protection works inside the Windows kernel, (the core of the operating system), watching for malware and stopping it before it has a chance to execute on your system.

VIPRE includes comprehensive protection against e-mail viruses, with direct support for Outlook, Outlook Express and Windows Mail; and support for any email program that uses POP3 and SMTP. In reading their product information, I found more good information on the product than I could possibly include in this column, so please visit their Web site and look it over carefully for full information. <<http://www.sunbeltsoftware.com/Home-Home-Office/VIPRE/>>.

This company is not based on some small Pacific atoll, or some strange sounding name of a country you never heard of, but is located in Clearwater, Florida where their tech support will speak good English (maybe Spanish if you need that) if you need to talk to them. Trip Kirk, Sales Engineer for Sunbelt Software, said they'll offer user group members the following coupon code (DealsGuy) that's good for \$5 off of any Vipre consumer license through August 31, 2009 at <<http://shop.sunbelt-software.com/licensing.cfm?product=VIPRE>>. Trip says that can be a single license, a two-computer license, or even the unlimited home license, which is good for as many computers as someone has at their one home address; or if they have computers in Florida and also in another state, such as snowbirds can, they can use it for all of the computers that they personally own. I guess that being surrounded by seniors in Clearwater has influenced them favorably.

For what it's worth, I realize that you can instantly name at least six places to find FREE protections of all types, but it can also be said that “you get what you pay for?” Just about every free protection product also offers a pay version with added features that they hope you'll buy later on to give better peace of mind. Here you get the

peace of mind right up front. I have not had the chance to try this product.

*What's This, A Photo Production Line?

Bits&Coffee has released BatchPhoto V 2.5, a powerful Windows photo manipulation program that makes it easy to annotate, touch up, transform, apply effects, convert, and rename hundreds of pictures in a single operation. BatchPhoto lets you select a group of images, define a series of edits, and apply them in a single operation rather than individually.

With version 2.5, BatchPhoto introduces Raw Photo Development. DSLR digital cameras can save the raw image data as read by the optical sensor without any loss or additional processing. The resulting files, often called raw images or digital negatives, need additional processing on the PC with specialized software. Almost every digital camera manufacturer has one or several different file formats for storing the raw image data, which leads to poor support from software vendors. BatchPhoto can read and convert most of those formats, including formats from digital camera makers like: Canon, Nikon, Sony, Olympus, Fuji, Kodak, or Pentax.

By taking advantage of multi-core processors, BatchPhoto can convert hundreds or even thousands of raw images to common image formats like JPEG or TIFF in a single session. Custom defined settings, like White Balance or Demosaicing, allow the user to control the development process in detail. Additional filters and transformations can be applied to photos in the same session (e.g. Watermark, Resize, Sepia and so on).

BatchPhoto can convert the raw images to dozens of image formats, including: JPG, TIF, PDF, PNG, GIF, BMP, EPS, TGA, and PSD. It can also change the meaningless names assigned by digital cameras to custom keyword based names, in the same operation. A second new feature is the ability to create PDF documents from multiple images. In the same process each image can be annotated, watermarked, and adjusted.

Overall, BatchPhoto has more than three-dozen graphical filters that can be applied to pictures. The filters are divided into four main categories; Annotate, Touch Up, Transform, and Effects. BatchPhoto adds itself to Windows Explorer's contextual (right-click) menu, so the user can apply predefined, or custom defined profiles to groups of pictures with ease.

BatchPhoto V. 2.5 runs under all versions of Windows, including Windows Vista and Windows Server 2008. Home version is priced at \$29.95 (US), and Pro at \$59.95 (US). User group members get a 40% discount on the purchase of BatchPhoto by using the discount coupon 5A1398E4 when ordering, and it's good through June 2009. <<http://www.batchphoto.com/>>.

*How About Better Efficiency

Almeza Company has announced LeaderTask Company Management 6.4, a smart solution for managing employees' projects, processes, company documents, and relations with clients. Designed to facilitate and streamline workflow, the system offers essential tools for managing task assignments, scheduling appointments, tracking project status, evaluating employees' efficiency, and many more.

To save time and effort, LeaderTask Company Management has been developed. Q. How can I keep my PC clean and tidy?

Like changing your car's oil or replacing your home's air conditioner filter, a little PC cleaning pays off with a faster, more reliable, and longer-lasting computer.

Although nothing suggested here is either rocket science or inherently dangerous, always follow the medical adage, "First, do no harm". So don't do anything that makes you uncomfortable (perhaps have a more experienced person clean up while you watch and learn), and back up your system and data. Then reboot, to get a clean start, and don't open any programs,

Before starting, to measure what your cleanup deletes, determine how full your hard drive is. Open My Computer, Right Click your hard drive (usually labeled "Local Disk (C:)"), and click Properties. Note how much space is used and free, then close the dialogue box.

Next, use Windows' built-in disk cleaning tool. Click Start, All Programs, Accessories, System Tools, Disk Cleanup, and the drive to clean, likely C. Choose what to clean; default selections are usually what you need. To be extra thorough, if your system has been running problem free, click the More Options tab and then Clean Up System

Restore. Confirm your choice and click OK.

Delete Web browser temporary files. Using Internet Explorer, click Tools on the Menu Bar, Internet Options, and Delete Files under the General tab. Other browsers provide similar functions, sometimes using "cache" to refer to the collection of temporary files.

Delete unneeded personal files, items outdated and no longer used. While most Microsoft Office programs (Word, Excel, etc.) store their files in the My Documents folder, you may have changed this default location. And other apps likely have their own favorite places to stash files. Look around, since cluttered files

make Windows work harder to get things done and waste time and resources when they're backed up. If you collect photos, music and such, delete those you no longer want or need, perhaps saving them on CD/DVD or ISB drive. Sorting files by size or date helps find deletion candidates.

If you run PC-based email software, it's worth periodically purging Sent and Trash folders, perhaps pitching material older than a certain date. Then look for a Compact Folders option, sometimes on the File pulldown menu, which squeezes out unused space from email folders.

Weed out software no longer used or useful by uninstalling applications with Window's Control Panel Add/Remove Software tool.

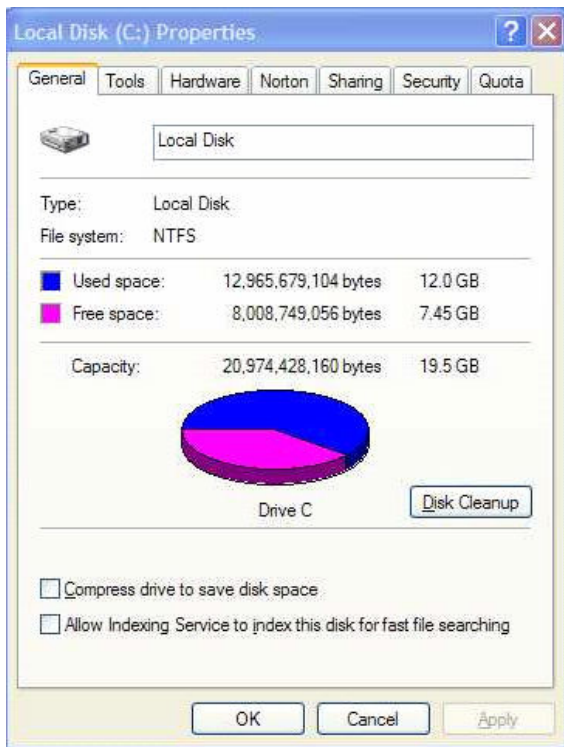
The Recycle Bin, which preserves erased files for recovery until it's emptied, has likely grown during this cleanup process. To empty it, Right Click its Windows desktop icon and click Empty Recycle Bin. Note that programs such as Norton Utilities may offer other cleanup options for the Recycle Bin and other Windows components.

Finally, remember that when writing to your hard drive, Windows places bits of each file in the next available open space on the hard drive.

While Windows can reassemble them, having many files fragmented slows access to them. So, to store all files as single entities, periodically defragment the hard drive. To do this, click Start, All Programs, Accessories, System Tools, Disk Defragmenter, select a drive, and click Defragment.

When finished, compare the amount of hard drive space used and free to what you saw initially. If this is the first cleanup you've done in a while, the amount of space recovered may surprise you.

- **Monitor Your Accounts Online:** To protect yourself from identity theft, check your bank accounts and credit cards online every day - if anything strange happens with one of your accounts, such as a purchase you didn't make, you'll notice it within a day or two. According to the 2009 Identity Fraud Survey Report from Javelin Strategy And Research, most people typically don't realize they've been the victim of an identity theft until 34 days after the initial crime; what's more sobering is that if someone else discovers the breach, typically 102 days have transpired since the criminal first invaded your account.
- **Has Your GPS Gotten Lost?:** Problems with GPS (global positioning system) devices never come at a convenient time. Most often, buildings, mountains, and other large structures block sufficient access to GPS satellite signals. If this happens to you, patience is key. After you travel through a dead spot, the device should pick up the satellite signal again and get you back on track. Actively finding an area with open sky should help you get back on track quicker. You can also try facing to the south because many GPS satellites are positioned in the southern area of the sky. The eastern and western parts of the sky have some satellites, and there are very few satellites in the north.
- **Clean Your Touchscreen:** Devices with touchscreens, such as an iPod touch, a GPS (global positioning system) unit, and even some camera LCDs (liquid-crystal displays), often get pretty dirty and have obvious fingerprint marks. To clean your touchscreen, turn off the device, then wipe it with a soft cotton cloth. Be sure to use an up and down motion when doing so and don't use paper towels, as they can destroy the polarizer. If you want, you can spray a nonammonia-based glass cleaner onto the CLOTH, not the actual screen, and make sure it is only slightly damp, not dripping wet.





Genealogy Workshop

May 6 Genealogy Workshop

May 6, a nice Spring day, and our workshop attendance (8) reflected the fact that sitting indoors talking history is sometimes just as attractive as being out in the good weather.

We started off with a review of **Al Seymour's** 10 foot long ancestor chart. The chart took in ancestor's going back to his 8th generation grandfather! Accompanying the chart was a three-quarter inch thick book of print-outs of ancestors from a PDF file he had created. The remarkable part of this notebook was the total linking he put into it by inserting hyperlinks on each branch at the edges of the pages so that a reader can instantly switch from one page to another (in the on-screen version, that is!) The insertion of the hyperlinks was a prodigious task in that he had to edit each line to create the links. Using the word 'remarkable' is fitting in referring to any of Al's work: he has done so much and in such detail that one can only think of him as a true professional genealogist. Al continued with comments and snippets of information about his ancestors that were fascinating and enlightening. Thanks again, Al!

Marilyn Garrow commented on her first session in the Adult Ed class being conducted by Sheila Byrnes at West Genesee. It is a six session class with two field trips to Onondaga Central Library's Local History and Genealogy Center. Marilyn was quite enthusiastic about the class and what she would learn. Thank you, Marilyn.

Next up, I presented a review of **Dr. Marian Henry's** presentation at the April 18th CNYGS Meeting. Dr. Henry is a historian and genealogist from Rochester. She spoke about "Helpful Finding Aids for Genealogy in New York State". One of the primary resources she focused on was the New York State Library Historical Documents Inventory (www.nysl.nysed.gov/hdi.htm). It is available at state archives online catalog. It contains a description of holdings of all libraries with historical material. It can be used to find one-of-kind sources in obscure, small locations.

Dr. Henry's book, "New York Essays", is available through the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS). The NEHGS website for this book is:

Next, I showed some slides about my attempts to do research using the NYS Library site:

A search for archives in "Oneida County" yielded a listing of "Tax Assessment Rolls, 1851-1931", located on microfilm A4585

State Archives Information- tells me that microfilm may be borrowed through my local library for up to one month, and only at the library. I haven't had a chance to see how this plays out with the local libraries but I shall report results when I do.

Lastly, I spoke about some great print resources available at Liverpool Library:

"Going to Salt Lake City to do Family Research" by J. Carlyle Parker

"In Search of Your European Roots" by Angus Baxter

"Organizing and Preserving your Heirloom Documents" by Katherine Scott Sturdevant

And finally, we discussed taking a break for the summer. All agreed, so we will skip June, July, and August, then resume on Sept. 2, 2009, at 2:00 PM- ITT-Tech.

I look forward to resuming in September and invite any others that may be interested.

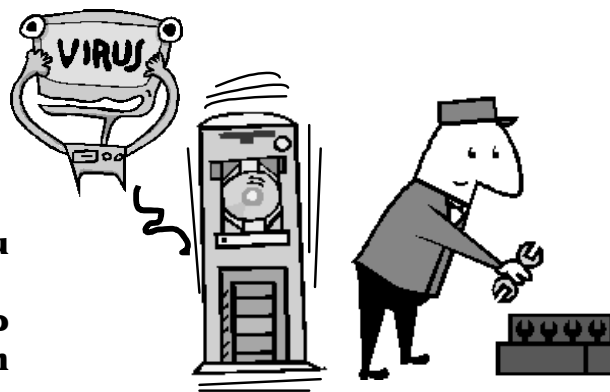

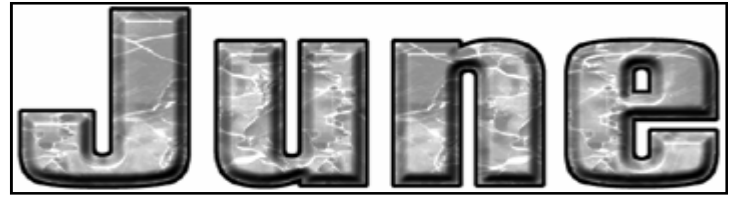

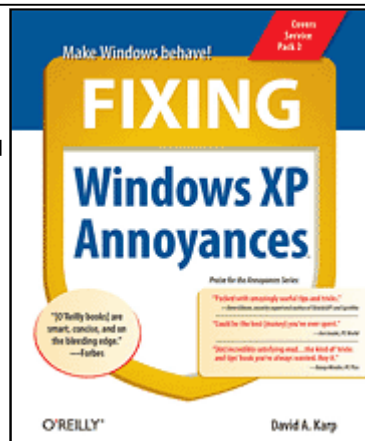
